EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT:

- 1) We are exceeding 2019 numbers in youth leagues. Basketball and soccer practices started last week, and games begin this weekend. Staff are excited to have enough registrations for 1st grade girls' basketball to have their own league and numbers for indoor have tripled.
- 2) The largest Cosmic Skate in recent history also happened on Saturday, January 22 with 350 people in attendance.

- 3) Specialty and solo tryouts were held for Northbrook-On-Ice. Tickets for the Mother's Day weekend event start in February.
- 4) The Sports Center hosted GBN's Senior Night. It went off smoothly despite their loss. Compliments were received about our new Sports Center Manager, Joey Sanchez.
- 5) Full-time staff are returning to work Adventure Campus next week while we reignite recruiting efforts. A letter will be sent to parents asking if they have flexibility to modify their schedules for the remainder of the year.
- 6) The cold temperatures have allowed Park Staff to make and maintain ice at our two outdoor rinks for 24 straight days. This is our longest consecutive streak for outdoor ice in several years. Conditions look favorable until the middle of next week when higher temperatures may create unsuitable ice conditions.
- 7) The Marketing & Communications department has new staff members. Marybeth Stone is the part-time Marketing Assistant and Claire Cinquegrani is the new full-time Graphic Designer and Brand Specialist. A new Digital Marketing Strategist is in the process of being hired as well. Hiring for the part-time sponsorship and advertising position will be held in March.
- 8) M&C developed a senior wellness mailer that was sent to almost 300 Senior Center members as well as 1,100 additional seniors in our ActiveNet database.
- 9) Playground postcards were mailed to neighbors of Cedar Lane Tot Lot and Meadowhill Park. There are 172 votes in the Cedar Lane survey and 52 votes in the Meadowhill Park survey. Results are neck and neck right now. Voting closes February 2.
- 10) Two articles were published this month: "Grant Funding Supports Sustainable Design at the Northbrook Park District" in IP&R, the state magazine, and "Sustainable Construction Decisions: A natural solution for the Northbrook Park District" in NRPA's Parks & Recreation Magazine.
- 11) 2022 Heritage Oaks Permanent Tee Time lottery registration is underway. Twenty tee time slots will be available for selection on Saturday and Sunday for a total of 40 tee times. Registration closes February 13 and the lottery will be held Thursday, February 17 at 7pm. Thirteen entrees have been received as of this morning.
- 12) This month the golf simulators have been active with over 320 hours of usage. This represents a utilization rate in excess of 50% of available the available time.
- 13) Village Manager Cara Pavlicek was the guest speaker at a Rotary dinner special event held in the Brook Room January 18. Rotary has made the decision to move their weekly lunch meetings to the Heritage Oaks Brook Room.
- 14) On Friday, January 14, Executive Director Hamer and Directors Baron, Loftus and Scovic presented at the online Leadership Northbrook session. Staff worked with the Northbrook Library to create goody bags that were delivered to each of the 20 Leadership Northbrook participants. This year, Park District staff attending Leadership Northbrook include Senior Human Resources Manager Bozarth, Activity Center Supervisor Tandy, and Grounds Supervisor Ryerson.
- 15) On Wednesday, January 26, several staff members attended the virtual Annual State of the Village Address.
